INTRODUCTION Last Sunday, Jesus took us to the transfiguration mountain to open our eyes a bit to the glory we miss when we live in sin. Today is a call to repentance and the life of grace.

INTRODUCTION The readings of today speak volumes about God's grace and mercies upon a repentant heart. They even make it impossible for us to ignore talking about this grace and its implications for us in lent.

INTRODUCTION

At times, we are tempted to view repentance as something unimportant. On the contrary, it is an essential step to salvation. It is a way through which God mediates his grace to us. **Repentance is, feeling sorry for the sin** we commit and a firm resolve not to commit it again deliberately. Sincere repentance provokes God's compassion, mercy, and love.

1ST READING Ex. 3:1-8a, 13-15

The First reading places the basis of God's grace in God's deep compassion, love and mercy, and talks about the grace of pity, mercy and deliverance for the people of Israel.

1st READING Ex. 3:1-8a, 13-15

Moses sees a fearful yet interesting sight of a burning bush but not consumed. Such depicts the nature of our God. That our God is never tired of us, never abandoning us, never withdraws his favour from us. Such sight however tells another story, that God continues to attract our attention and invites us. God invites us to a renewed covenant each day.

2ND READING 1 Corr. 10:1-6,10-12 The second reading reminds us of the consequences of deliberately abusing God's grace. It traces the death of the Israelites to their inability to please God. Hence, Paul concluded by reminding us that "All these happened as a warning, and was written down to be a lesson for us who are living at the end of the age.

GOSPEL READING Luke 13:1-9

In the gospel, Jesus was straightforward in his words when he said: "Unless you repent, you will perish." One might say that this is too harsh to come from Christ. The truth is that this does not diminish his compassion and mercy. Instead, it shows that he cares for us and sees what we cannot see. He simply warns us of the negative consequences of living a sinful life.

GOSPEL READING Luke 13:1-9

Also, the Gospel talks further about this abuse of Grace, highlights the Grace of second chance and the threat of uncertain final chance! The **Gospel consists of two different** stories that are joined by a common theme of the need to repent without delay

WHAT DO I DO WITH TICKING CLOCK OF GRACE?

The answer to this question is in form of admonition from God made on us for our repentance and divine forgiveness from God. The season of lent could also be seen as the season of grace. Let us see what God wants us to do with this ticking clock

REPENT

The call of Christ today is for repentance. It is an urgent call that requires an urgent response. "Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool".

2. TURN ASIDE

We need to turn aside like Moses and tarry a while so we can take instructions from God in this Holy Season.

3. UTILISE YOUR SECOND CHANCE Make the most of the day! **Redeem your time!! It is never** too late until you are Late. We need to realize we have had more than three years and we do not know how much is left. Do not take God' grace for Solemnities granted

CONCLUSION

Dear friends, God is calling us to remove our sandals in this season of Lent. The sandals of sinfulness should be pulled off, so we can see him and hear him speak to us.
